Project Planning & Software Development Process Rubric:

Story Creation	Well-written full set of Stories created that capture the user experience for features. Task time estimates are totaled for each Story so the Customer can determine their priority.	Several Stories created that outline the user experience for features. Time estimates are supplied so Customer can determine the set of Stories to be chosen for the Sprint.	Basic Stories created for a couple features along with some estimates to help Customer choice.
Task Creation	Well-written Tasks created for the Sprint's possible set of Stories that detail the development work needed to fully accomplish them. Time estimates assigned to each Task and appropriately assigned to Team members and pairs for execution. Additional Tasks for future stories placed in Backlog.	Set of Tasks is created along with fair estimates for sufficient Stories to determine priority of Stories for current Sprint. Tasks are assigned to team members and pairs for execution. Tasks for later work placed in Backlog.	Series of Tasks created for Stories with general estimates. Tasks chosen for Sprint but may not be assigned clearly to team members.
Exit Criteria Creation	Exit Criteria test cases created for the Sprint's Stories with clear details on execution and expectations. Include required data files and use cases to be demonstrated along with the corresponding expected results.	Exit Criteria test cases created to meet the need of each Story that include clear expectations for success. Sufficient to demonstrate Story but may lack a few details.	General test cases documented for Stories that suggest what is needed for Exit Criteria. Lack specific details of the use cases to be demonstrated.
Sprint Stand Up Meetings	Stand Up meetings are held regularly and last less than 10 minutes and clearly cover what each individual and/or pair has been working on, will be currently working on, and any challenges faced. Digression to other discussion minimal.	Stand Up meetings are held and last less than 15 minutes and clearly cover what each individual and/or pair has been working on, will be currently working on, and any challenges faced. Some digression experienced.	Stand Up meetings occur occasionally but did not follow guidelines

Customer Satisfaction (& Communications)	Customer understands resulting progress. The work on the Stories and resulting features continue to meet their expectations and meeting goals for overall project schedule is clear.	Progress on the Stories and resulting features mostly meeting the expectations of the Customer and goals for overall project schedule can be managed.	Some progress is apparent but generally does not meet the expectations of the Customer. Challenges agreeing to the goals for overall project schedule.
Delivering the Project & Features	Individual features and overall project is delivered and released planning directly with the Customer and the development team matches the expectations they have set.	Individual features and overall project is delivered and released reasonably within the expectations of the Customer. The development team generally meets the expectations they have set, but may have a few delays	Individual features are released periodically meeting some of the expectations of the Customer. Overall project moves forward but likely not as the Customer had expected it.
