WarGames came out in 1983 and despite this, it addresses several issues and concerns about computers that remain today. **Please review the questions below and take an occasional note while you watch the film so you can answer the “a)” questions after the film.** The “b)” questions require you to think about the current use of computers and how each concept is relevant today. Answer all questions after the movie and there will be time on Friday to possibly finish the movie and complete this worksheet. This worksheet is worth 15 points of class work.

## Background:

From the mid-1940's to 1991, the US and the Soviet Union both had built up nuclear weapons and had missiles aimed at each in a continuing state of fear of nuclear war, referred to as the “Cold War”. NORAD, the North American Aerospace Defense Command ([www.norad.mil](http://www.norad.mil)), was established to monitor airspace to detect any such missiles approaching the US and Canada. NORAD continues to monitor airspace today to detect any air attacks from the north and ensure the security of the US and Canada.

## 1. Passwords
